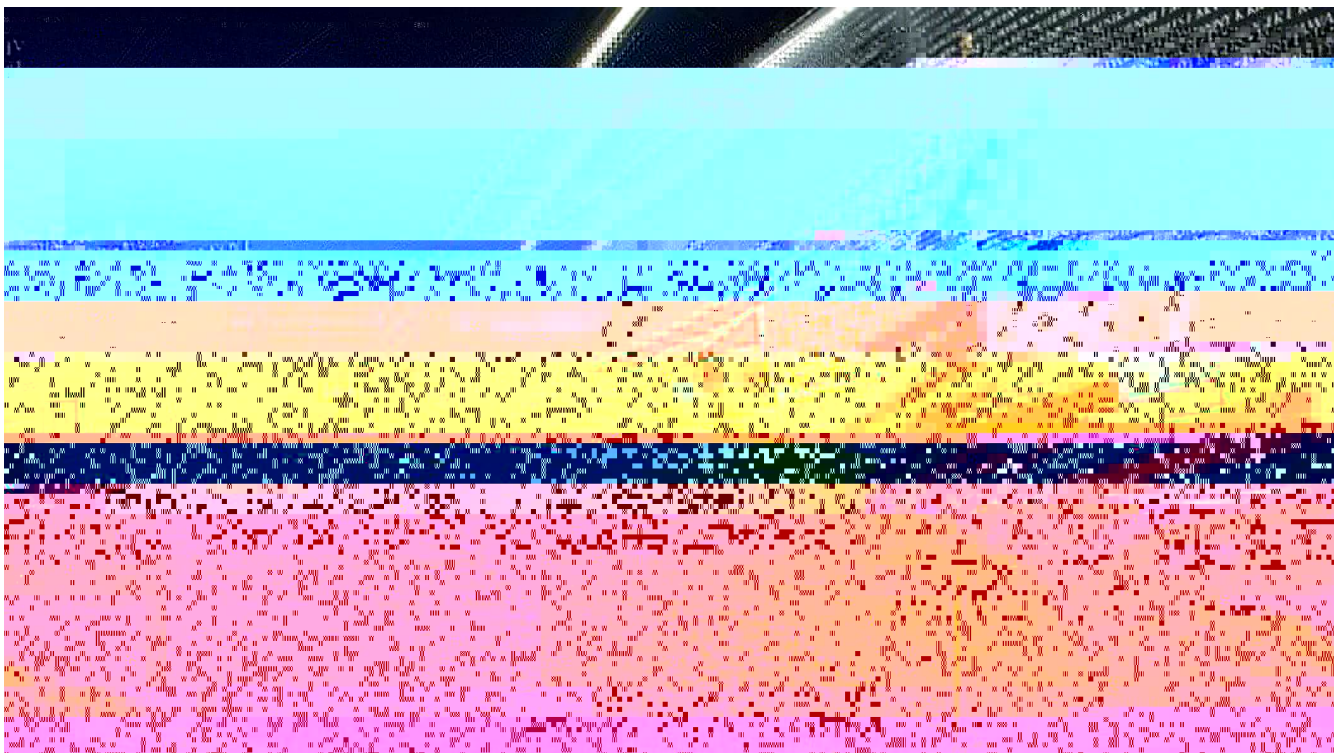

The Wall That Heals

The Vietnam Veterans Memorial Fund's The Wall That Heals exhibit includes a three-quarter scale replica of the Vietnam Veterans Memorial along with a mobile Education Center. The 24th season of The Wall That Heals visited a number of communities this year including Athens earlier this summer

The traveling exhibit honors the more than three million Americans who served in the United States Armed Forces in the Vietnam War and it bears the names of the 58,211 men and women who made the ultimate sacrifice in Vietnam

Like the original memorial, The Wall That Heals is erected in a chevron shape and visitors can do name rubbings of individual service members' names. The replica is constructed of Avonite, a synthetic granite, and its 100 numbered panels are supported by an aluminum frame. Machine engraving of the names along with modern LED lighting provide readability day and night
